

How to Apply for a Marriage License

New Hampshire residents, as well as non-residents, who wish to marry must file for a marriage license.

Where to File: Couples can file in the office of any town or city clerk in the State of New Hampshire, regardless of their residency.

How to File: Both parties must appear before the City/Town Clerk to complete the application form, Monday through Friday between 8:30 am and 3:00 pm.

Documentation: When completing the application form, documentation as noted below will be required.

One or more of the following:

- A driver's license;
- A passport;
- A certified copy of a birth certificate;
- Any other license or identification that contains: a) a photograph of the applicant; and b) the applicant's name and the date of birth.
- If either or both parties have been previously married or previously joined in a civil union, a certified copy of the final divorce decree from the most recent marriage, a certified dissolution decree of the most recent civil union or a certified copy of the death record of the deceased spouse will be required from the applicant(s).

Fee: There is a \$45 license fee.

When and where the license can be used:

The license is valid for 90 days from the date of application and can be used anywhere in the State of New Hampshire.
